

Leeds International Summer School (LISS): Programme Overview

Dates	Saturday 6 July – Saturday 3 August 2019 (4 weeks) <i>For students who cannot attend the full duration there is an opportunity to join the wider group for two weeks of the programme (either block one or block two)</i>
Requirements	Minimum GPA of 2.8 (equivalent to a Leeds overall academic average of 56) IELTS 5.5 (5.5 overall with no component lower than 5.0) or TOEFL (iBT) 80 (80 overall, listening and reading: 18, speaking and writing: 19)
Deadline	1 May 2019 (www.leeds.ac.uk/summerapply)
Fee	£3,145 (£2,995 for applications received by 1 April 2019) <i>£1,770 two week fee (£1695 early fee)</i>
Fee includes	Tuition, academic field trips, excursions, on campus accommodation (Charles Morris), breakfast and lunch Monday – Friday, social programme, premium Sports Centre membership
Scholarships	Santander scholarships worth £500 available. If students have a GPA of 3.0 or above (or equivalent) they are eligible to apply to help pay for the programme fees
Discounts	10% group discount for institutions who send groups of 10 students or more
Excursions	Whitby, York, Harewood House, Yorkshire Dales, Lake District
Socials	A welcome orientation and farewell party are included in the fee. The LISS Social Assistants (current Leeds students, who live in the accommodation) also organise regular low cost weekend and evening socials throughout the programme.
Modules	Choose one module (course) from each block and earn credit (each module is worth 10 credits). Mix and match modules, or specialise in a particular subject area (see below). More information: www.leeds.ac.uk/summerstudy .
